Compare and contrast the experiences of two characters in two different fiction books. How are the characters the same in the texts? How are they different?	Write down the ages of people in your family. Draw a model of each age in IOs and is. Write three comparing equations using the numbers.	Make a list of people you know. Be sure to capitalize the first letter of each person's name.	Walk around your home to observe how different non-living things move. After your family meets with your teacher for conferences, list 3 things you are doing great at in first grade.
